Class Objective

The objective of CONF 795 is to equip GMU S-CAR students with the skills necessary to provide succinct analysis of current global conflicts and publish and produce work in today's print, television, and online media. The class will be highly experiential, offering students ample opportunities to learn the basics of letter and op-ed writing, TV and radio interviewing, and website development, and hone their skills as a conflict analyst.
